Tech Serve has developed a building system that allows us to bring everything needed to a jobsite. This is accomplished by putting everything needed into a shipping container. The planning begins well ahead of time where TSI works to design a suitable structure. From there the building is ordered and containerized along with everything needed to complete the building project. The container is shipped to the jobsite location thousands of miles away. This system allows the building crew to show up onsite and go to work with everything needed to accomplish the project. This system works well in locations with no existing infrastructure or available materials, or in high cost environments.

Over the years Tech Serve has shipped dozens of containers with dozens of buildings, from hospitals, to homes, to orphanages. If you have a project you would like us to review, please give us a call.

In September 2015 a crew assembled in Greenbrier to load a container for a missionary family moving to Papua New Guinea.

Initially the container began as a way to move all of their household items to PNG, but soon grew to include their new home.

Inside the container were their life's necessities, as well as red iron, building panels, and all the cabinets for the house.

When they arrive in Papua New Guinea, That They May Know missionaries lovingly work among Tribal people who have never heard the Good News of Jesus.

In addition TTMK is building one of the few Bible Schools in PNG, where they hope to train many National believers.



Bill and Celia Smith drove to Mississippi to pick up the red iron for the project. Bill drives the Tech Serve truck making many trips for materials and medical supplies.



Darrell and Anita McGinty volunteered to build all of the cabinets for the house.



Frank and Linda Jevicky volunteered to help load the container.



Hospital is not functioning well without current Technology.



When there is an emergency a gong ring is sounded and everyone must come running. All doctors, nurses, and staff rush to see what the emergency is about.



Tech Serve Staff engineer a solution and propose costs for needed equipment and supplies. TSI will use refurbished, low cost, or donated equipment if available. If not, then new equipment is used and paid for by donations, either by Tech Serve or by Hospital.

The Hospital hears about Tech Serve and asks for help. The situation is explained, feasibility is discussed, and plans are made.



Hospital approves project and necessary costs. Donation requests go out from Hospital, and Tech Serve to raise money for the needed equipment.

Interested people make donations to fund the project, the Hospital, and Tech Serve, to make it all happen.

Tech Serve Staff purchase and gather materials, prepare shipment, paperwork, and send equipment. Newsletter and phone calls begin to recruit volunteers who pay their own way to install the system.



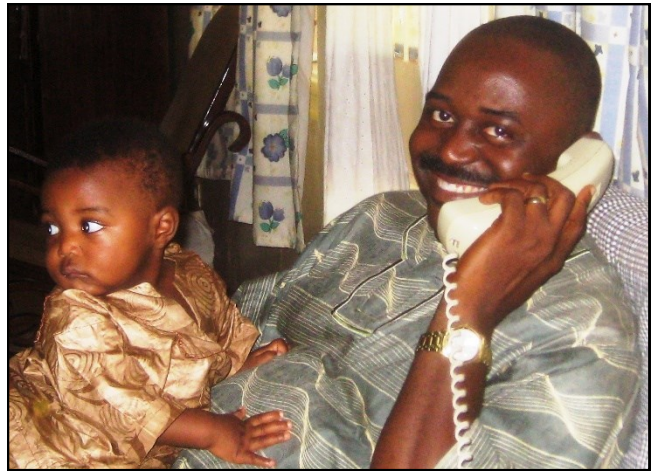
Equipment arrives, Tech Serve is notified, begins planning trip for installation and coordinating all volunteer travel.

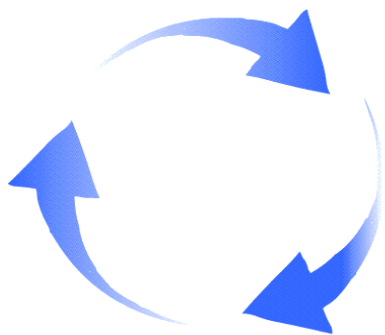
People just like you!

New emergency at the hospital, nurse can call the correct doctor to come for timely assistance, everyone else continues to perform their duties uninterrupted.



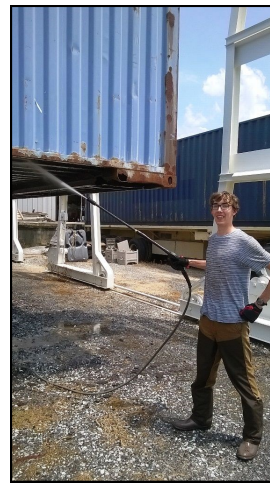
Tech Serve staff support the system with emails, calls , and visits for the life of the system (hopefully 20 years) providing help when needed.

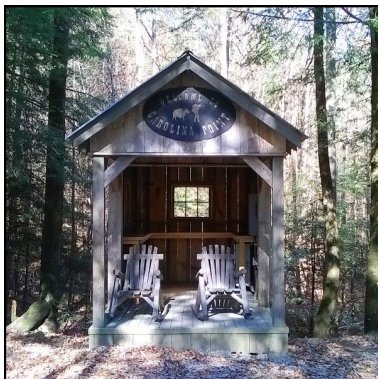
This Newsletter was printed on the new machine. 😊

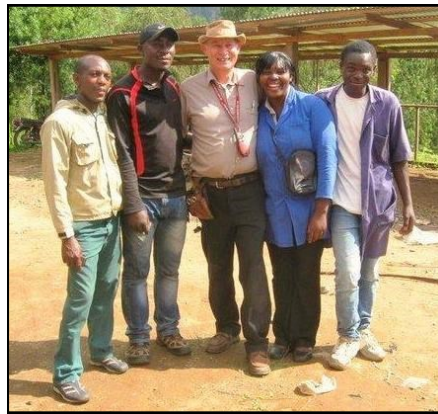
